- Amanda has been in contact with Mr. Rick Brown, MS4. She inquired as to the proposal amount for the dog park fencing. Kate Doyle, MS4 Coordinator indicated that she would get a copy of this. Amanda's reason for the inquiry is to find out what the "extra" \$1700.00 is for? Tariffs? Also, park board would like to know the material being used for the fence. Perhaps a different material can be used to keep costs down. Kate will forward invoice for review.
- New Dog Park Design and Scale: A new design (making the park smaller) was submitted by Mr. John Doyle for park board review.
- Park Regulations: Mr. Herrbach, Amanda and Police Chief Steve Dick discussed the importance of keeping park rules consistent with the other two parks in town. Signs will soon be ordered after review by attorney.
- Install Date: Amanda will stay in touch with Mr. Rick Brown for updates on install.
 Kate Doyle indicated that Long Beach may have some woodchips to donate for park use.
- Parking Lot: Mr. Jell Bruder, Street Commissioner will investigate contractors to shave down lot and install gravel or asphalt.

Approval of Fund A motion was made by Mrs. Heath to accept June 2018, Fund report; the motion was seconded by Mr. Silcox and was then unanimously carried.

Approval of Claims: A motion was made by Mr. Silcox to pay bills in the amount of \$ 343,698.51 (THREE HUNDRED FOURTY THREE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED NINTY EIGHT DOLLARS AND FIFTY-ONE CENTS) the motion was seconded by Mrs. Neumaier and was then unanimously carried.

MS4: Kate Doyle in attendance to report that the Town of Long Beach could possibly make a donation of wood chips for park use. The MS4 Budget hearing next month, she will report back.

Attorney: Mr. Bill Herrbach, Town Attorney in attendance.

- Permit Fees: Town code 1026 will be updated and effective 2019. Changes to fees include a \$50.00 per inspection fee. Also, Bill Herrbach will revise inspectors' contracts for review and signature by inspectors for file.
- Dog Park Rules: Bill indicates this will require an ordinance that he will prepare for next months meeting.
- Other New Ordinances: Front Yard Parking and Parking in Public Right of Ways. Mr. Herrbach will prepare for council signature at August 2018 meeting.
- Abandoned Houses: Mr. Herrbach stated that the courts have approved demolition of 110 Harding. Also, 235 Harding will go through the same legal process. Mr. Herrbach asked council for a motion to approve moving forward on demolition of 110 Harding and the legal process to eventually demolish 235 Harding. A motion was made by Mrs. Heath to put the necessary money (approx. 9-12k) in the 2019 budget for demolition of 110 Harding and legal fees for the court process on 235 Harding.

Engineer: John Doyle in attendance.

- Melody Lane Project: Walsh and Kelly paving invoice \$ 21,920.16, Mr. Doyle recommends payment to be made. DeBoer EGolf will be fixing some of the landscaping, Mr. Doyle will report back next month.
- Roeske Project (INDOT GRANT): D&M will be onsite tomorrow to finish project. Will be completed this week
- Light Posts (Roeske Project) Mr. Bruder, Street Commissioner will be getting with NIPSCO to get estimates on lighting for this street. He did however speak with a subcontractor for NIPSCO and found out that NIPSCO will be eventually switching all lights to LED, he will be contacting them for timeline.
- 2019 Street Improvement Projects: Mr. Doyle submitted a list of multiple street improvement projects estimating currently at \$440,000.00. A motion was made by Mrs. Heath to move forward with the proper estimating on these projects, motion was seconded by Mr. Studtman and was then unanimously carried, with the assistance of the INDOT GRANT if received.
